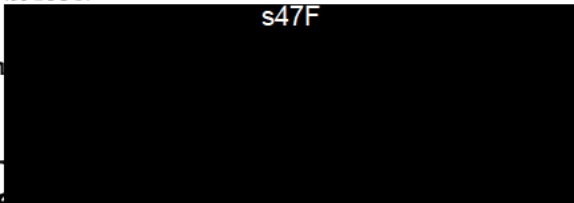

**Definitions for family travel under relevant legislation**

<p><b>Spouse/De facto partner</b> Under section 3 of the <i>Parliamentary Entitlements Act 1990</i>, the spouse of a Senator or Member includes the de facto partner of a Senator or Member within the meaning of the <i>Acts Interpretation Act 1901</i> (AIA Act). Section 2F of the AIA Act provides that a person is the de facto partner of another person, whether of the same sex or a different sex, if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the person is in a registered relationship with the other person; or</li> <li>• the person is in a de facto relationship with the other person, that is, the persons: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– are not legally married to each other; and</li> <li>– are not related by family; and</li> <li>– have a relationship as a couple living together on a genuine domestic basis.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>Nominee</b> A person nominated by the Senator or Member and approved at the discretion of the Special Minister of State or a person authorised by the Special Minister of State to approve a nominee on his/her behalf.</p>	<p><b>Dependent children</b> A dependent child is a person who is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• under 16 who <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– is in the custody, care and control of the Senator or Member or is a person to whom the Senator or Member has access; or</li> <li>– where no other person has the custody, care and control of the person, is wholly or substantially in the care and control of the Senator or Member; or</li> </ul> </li> <li>• at least 16 but under 25 and is wholly or substantially dependent upon the Senator or Member; and</li> <li>• NOT otherwise receiving the entitlements of a nominee.</li> </ul> <p><b>Designated person</b> A designated person means a person (other than a dependent child, spouse/de facto partner, nominee or member of staff) who:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• is substantially dependent on the Senator or Member; or</li> <li>• has significant caring responsibilities for a person substantially dependent on the Senator or Member; or</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• has significant caring responsibilities for the Senator or Member's spouse/de facto partner, nominee or dependent child; or</li> <li>• is any other family member of the Senator or Member.</li> </ul> <p><b>Home base of a Senator or Member</b> The home base of a Senator or Member shall be his or her principal place of residence.</p> <p><b>Home base for a Minister or Office Holder</b> For a Minister or Office Holder required to spend continuous periods in Canberra on official business, the home base shall be the place of residence which they maintain and to which they would ordinarily return if they were not required to spend the continuous periods in Canberra on official business.</p> <p><b>Further information</b> If you require any further information, the Entitlements Manager below will be pleased to assist you:</p> <p>QLD, SA (02) 6215 3827 NSW, WA, ACT (02) 6215 3426 VIC, TAS, NT (02) 6215 3640</p>
